POLICY POSITIONS



Calls for voting and campaign finance reforms

- Would re-enact provisions in the Voting Rights Act, make Election Day a federal holiday, implement universal same-day voter registration, allow universal mail-in voting, and restore voting rights for individuals with certain convictions; calls for broad campaign finance reforms including prohibiting corporations from donating to political campaigns and strengthening disclosure requirements



Addresses trade agreements' impacts on workers, educational opportunities, and pro-union legislation

- Supports repealing trade deals that outsource US jobs; seeks to update the Trade Adjustment Assistance program, which aims to help workers displaced by trade agreements



Prioritizes drug pricing, Medicare, and abortion

- Plans to reduce prescription drug prices by facilitating government negotiation, setting a limit on out-of-pocket costs for the elderly, fixing prices for major drugs like insulin, and creating the Office of Drug Manufacturing to stabilize drug prices; pledges to expand Medicare coverage to include dental, hearing, and vision care; hopes to secure coverage for mental health services as well as services in rural areas

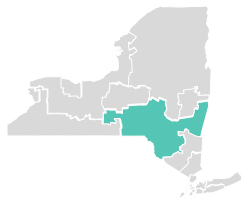
