POLICY POSITIONS



Calls for economic reforms to protect the fiscal security of the middle class

Views of the economy center around the belief that the economy should work for "everyday folks"; supports raising the minimum wage to \$15 an hour, and would support all workers efforts to organize and collectively bargain; calls for tax reforms that would close loopholes for the wealthiest Americans to get out of paying "their fair share"



Would increase resources for law enforcement along the US-Mexico border

On his campaign website, Gallego states that "while our border communities are not the war zones that news stations often
portray them as, they are facing a serious crisis," and he expresses support for increased border patrol and securing ports of
entry; hopes to protect and expand Arizona's manufacturing as a means to support the US military; calls for military policies
that ensure protection from countries such as China, Russia, and Iran
