POLICY POSITIONS



Centerpiece of 2015 campaign

 Created Task Force on Equity which crafted "Rising Together" job program plan that recommended generating 20,000 jobs by 2022, primarily for low-wage workers; supports raising the minimum wage as a way of addressing income inequality in Houston, and signed executive order raising airport worker wages to \$12/hour by 2021



Greater attention post-Hurricane Harvey

Launched disaster mitigation strategy that, in part, prioritized investments to improve resiliency including a plan for 100 new
green storm water infrastructure projects in five years; worked to streamline permitting process on new wireless infrastructure
projects to speed up 5G deployment and bridge digital divide in underserved communities



Shoring up city coffers and investing in tech

Worked to address \$7.8 billion in unfunded pensions by lowering rates of return and negotiated cuts to COLAs and DROPs
while having city issue pension obligation bonds to reduce unfunded liabilities; promotes city to tech industry, dubbed "Sili con
Bayou", by creating innovation districts and courting businesses like Amazon to open tech hubs
