Background

A lifelong public servant with a record of victories in both local and state elections, Molinaro emphasized issues related to fiscal policy and mental health

Born in Yonkers, New York, and raised by a single mother, Molinaro worked as an intern for fmr. state Assemblymember Eileen Hickey (D-NY97) during high school

In 1994, Molinaro entered public service at the age of 18 as a member of the Village of Tivoli's board of trustees; one of the youngest people to be mayor in the United States, he was elected in 1995 as mayor of Tivoli

After earning an associates degree from Dutchess Community College and attending the Land Use Leadership Alliance (LULA) training program at Pace University, Molinaro was elected to the Dutchess County legislature, where he served for four terms

In 2006, Molinaro was elected to represent the 103rd District in the New York Assembly; following his time in the legislature, Molinaro was elected in 2011 as county executive for Dutchess County

During his tenure as county executive, Molinaro introduced the "ThinkDIFFERENTLY" program aimed at increasing access for individuals with disabilities and developed an economic development strategy called "4RFuture: Reform, Retain, Reinvest, Recruit," which was designed to boost private investment in New York

Lost in the 2018 general election for governor of New York to then- Gov. Andrew Cuomo
